Hambleton

1. A question was asked regarding the Pumping Station capacity, particularly in relation to new Planning Applications.

PL reported that if additional capacity is required it must be supplied by United Utilities. It was assumed that capacity was sufficient for Planning.

Concern raised regarding Overflow of Pumping Station, PL assumed that it was working correctly and that it was UU's responsibility to check.

PL agreed to request details of maximum capacity and current usage.

- 2. PL reported that UU was ¾ way through the installation of the promised Flow meters (at the last Flood Forum
- 3. River Defence Scheme Planning Application due Jan 23 (since been revised to Spring 23) EA need to build in additional drainage to the plan.
- 4. Marsh Lane PROW EA are awaiting permission from Landowners before action can be taken to clear the River/Dyke.
- 5. Other updates:

Carr Lane Cleaning is partially complete and severed drain has been fixed Birkrigg/Coppins culvert is across the road.

Pauls Lane collapsed drain now sorted

A new main drain is being installed in Arthurs Lane

Kiln Lane/Sherbourne Road - mostly fixed

- 6. PL reported that the sewerage coming up on Kiln Lane should go into surface water drain, this has a greater capacity.
- 7. Need to consider a container in village to store sandbags and Flooding signs.
- 8. The large development in Stalmine has been passed and this may create further issues in Hambleton in the Foul drains.

Stalmine

- 1. Wardleys Lane The culvert has been cleared but the issue is ongoing
- 2. Smithy Lane and Occupation Lane issues have now been sorted and cleared.
